	The Insurance and Long-term savings sector has made significant progress on setting targets to reach Net Zero, with the ABI becoming a Race To Zero accelerator in order to keep this momentum up. In 2023, the focus has increasingly turned from the ambition of target-setting to the actions needed to reach those targets.
